

Command's Wake

Miniatures campaign (scenario book)



Various historical frameworks designed to provide strategic background and narrative depth to your miniature campaigns.

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The following are four possible scenarios.

As can be seen, for example, in the first case, The Pyrrhic Wars, the Roman armies in the year 300 could only fight those powers whose distance from Rome was less than or equal to the sum of Rome's influence with the target power. In this case, they are:

- Cisalpine Gaul: $30+20$ (sum of both influences) > 15
- Etruria
- Samnium
- Magna Graecia
- Lucania-Apulia

But not with the rest. For example, the influence of Syracuse added to that of Rome is $20+30=50 < 60$ (the distance between the two).

As battles are fought, the influence of each power varies. Additionally, at the end of each turn, a fixed amount is subtracted (or added): vitality, which appears on the Vitality Table. This adjustment is applied to the power's Influence before the start of the next turn.

In the year 280, Epirus appears with an initial influence of 30.

As explained in the rules, if a power is left with no (or negative) influence at the end of a turn, it disappears and cannot be used again.



SCENARIO: THE PYRRHIC WARS (300 – 250 BC)

Rome expands its power in Italy against the Etruscans and Samnites before the intervention of Epirus in 280 BC. The conflict involves Carthage and Syracuse in a geographical setting that spans from Cisalpine Gaul to Sicily.

- Historical Period: 300 BC to 250 BC
- Time Scale: 1 Actual Week = 5 Campaign Years.

SCENARIO: THE COLLAPSE OF THE BRONZE AGE (1250 BC – 1180 BC)

The Hittite and Egyptian empires faced a systemic crisis due to the invasion of the Sea Peoples in a geographical area encompassing the eastern Mediterranean. The Mycenaean collapse and instability in Canaan coincided with a power vacuum exploited by powers such as Assyria and Elam.

- Historical Period: 1250 BC to 1180 BC
- Time Scale: 1 Actual Week = 10 Campaign Years.

SCENARIO: HELLENISTIC ZENITH AND DECLINE (260 – 200 BC)

The great kingdoms of the Diadochi reached their maturity while facing internal fragmentation and significant threats on their borders. The chronic conflict between the Seleucid and Ptolemaic empires for control of the Levant coincided with the collapse of the Mauryan Empire in India, allowing the rise of emerging powers such as Parthia, Pergamon, and the Greco-Bactrian Kingdom. In Greece and Anatolia, the Achaean and Aetolian Leagues, together with various smaller kingdoms, challenged the hegemony of Macedonia. The geographical setting stretched from the Balkans to beyond the Indus Valley.

- Historical Period: 260 BC to 200 BC
- Time Scale: 1 Actual Week = 5 Campaign Years.

SCENARIO: THE DECLINE OF THE BALKANS (1450 AD – 1460 AD)

The Ottoman Empire besieges the last remnants of Byzantium and pressures Serbia and Hungary in their advance into Europe. Within this geographical context, powers such as Venice and Moldavia struggle to resist.

- Historical Period: 1450 AD to 1460 AD
- Time Scale: 1 Actual Week = 2 Campaign Years.
